Senator Margaret "Maggie" Hassan (D-NH) is a strong supporter of labor, education, and Veterans' issues, among others. She has introduced or cosponsored major legislation that would help expand the American workforce and access to education. Of particular interest to NCDA members, Senator Hassan introduced a bill to amend the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) to establish a career pathways grant program, a program that could directly benefit career development practitioners. The Senator is also on the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions (HELP), the key committee that oversees much of NCDA's policy interests. As a member of the Senate HELP Committee, Senator Hassan plays a major role in issues related to labor, education, pensions, Veterans, social security, and spending.
